BRONX-WESTCHESTER CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT December 22, 1991

The 68th Bronx-Westchester Christmas Count recorded 122 species, much higher than the ten year average of 116. The combination of past warm winters and great weather for the count day resulted in 18 new high counts, 2 tied high counts, plus 3 twenty year highs and 10 ten year highs. Two new species for the count were seen, a female Barrow's Goldeneye seen near the Trogs-neck Bridge and a Western Kingbird in Rye. An additional new species was seen count week, when a Tufted Duck was found on the second lake near Read Preserve. The first Bald Eagle in 40 years was also seen at Read Preserve.

Other highlights included a Green-backed Heron in Pelham Bay Park, Eurasion Widgeon and Yellow-breasted Chat in Rye, Lesser Black Backed Gull around Playland Beach, and a Dickcissel on the Catskill Aqueduct in Yonkers.

Carolina Wrens continue to explode with 158 seen, as compared to 88 last year, 22 five years ago and 3 ten years ago. If the current trend continues we should see about 280 next year.

For the first time, the Rye Party reached 100 species, this continues to show the importance of nature preserves like Read and Marshlands Conservancy. Other County Parks in Westchester and City Parks in the Bronx also played a major role in the Count.
