## 79th Bronx-Westchester Christmas Bird Count December 22, 2002

The Bronx-Westchester CBC has seen well over 220 different species.

The Bronx-Westchester CBC found 124 species on December 22, 2002, one shy of last year's record. Eighty-four participants recorded 46,022 birds. The 125 species is a new record for this 78-year count.

Highlights include a new species. An incredible movement of Razorbills was seen as they flew west off the sound shore. A total of 116 were counted. Why they were that far west in the Sound is anybody's guess. Good vantage points included Edith Read Sanctuary, Milton Point and on the shore of Larchmont. The count has seen 221 species in its 79-year history.

Other notable species included: Red-necked Grebe (5th straight year) and Lesser Black-backed Gull at Read Sanctuary, along with two Northern Gannets, White-winged and Surf Scoters off shore.

Pelham Bay Park had a female White-winged Scoter plus two Saw-whet, Barn, and Long-eared Owls.

A Eurasian Wigeon was found on Premium Mill Pond, Larchmont.

Four Merlin were in the circle area, a new high count.

Van Cortlandt Park featured Eastern Phoebe, a flyover American Pipit and Orange-crowned Warbler on Vault Hill, (4th record for the count).

A Common Yellowthroat was found along the sound shore of the Bronx.

The count had two Yellow-breasted Chats, one in Woodlawn Cemetery at the lake and another in Larchmont.

For the second year in a row we had a Baltimore Oriole, found at the Greenburg Nature Center (9th record for the count).

There were new high counts for: Red-throated Loon (74), Common Loon (16), Long-tailed Duck (297), Red-breasted Merganser (835), Merlin (4), Wild Turkey (25), Rock Dove (2287), Carolina Wren (211), Yellow-breasted Chat (2), and Dark-eyed Junco (1775).

For the second year in a row there were more Red-bellied Woodpeckers (289) than Downy Woodpeckers (238)

American Crow numbers were way down with 820, lowest since 1983 (715). But to keep it in perspective American Crow numbers in the late 1990's had reach all time highs.

Other species with low numbers included Northern Shoveler, Black-capped Chickadee and House Finch. All had 20 + year lows. Only 19 Canvasbacks were found, mostly on the Hudson River.

Notable misses include Red-shouldered Hawk - only been missed 9 times but now three years in a row! We missed Ruddy Turnstone, first miss since 1982. Other misses include Redhead, Cedar Waxwing and Purple Finch.

Thanks to all who volunteered. The eighty-four people on the count included many new faces. I hoped you enjoyed your first count. Thirty-two of us enjoyed the compilation dinner, again held at San Martino Ristorante.

The complete compilation results are attached.

Next year's count date is still unclear and may change. Right now Southern Nassau is scheduled for the 28th so it looks like Sunday, December 21, 2003. Hope to see you there.
